By Car

Car Parking

By Bus

Edinbrugh's main terminal is situated in the city centre at St Andrws Swuare, in Elder street. Bus number 22 runs past he stadium. citylink.co.uk / lothianbuses.com

By Tram

Edinburgh's tram system runs from Edinburgh Airport into the city centre every 10 minutes. There is a stop conveniently located outside the stadium. edinburghtrams.com
