Care at Home

Role Outline

This role focusses on delivering personal care to clients in their own homes alongside supporting other care staff through supervision. . Household tasks, dressing, bathing, or mobility needs may be undertaken in this role. The focus of this role is to deliver care as outlined in the care plan and support clients to live as independently and safe as possible to the agreed professional standards.

You may work with people who have dementia or other complex care needs as part of this role.

You may also have to administer medication

You may also mentor and supervise staff and ensure they are motivated and supported in their roles.

You may also work alongside senior members of staff to identify any risks or challenges within the service.

You would be good in this role if you:

Like making meaningful relationships with people and enjoy helping others

Are able to keep calm in stressful situations

Are hands-on and practical

Are a people person with good communication skills

Able to use initiative

Able to work flexibly and as part of a wider team

Able to keep things confidential

Enjoy working independantly

Are kind and compassionate

Good working knowledge of standards and regulations

Benefits of the Role

This role is great for people who are looking for more responsibility in their caring role.

This combines caring for people and taking on more complex tasks.

You could be working in a variety of different teams or be taking on a more complex role.

This could involve carrying out additional delegated care responsibilities with appropriate training.

You may also mentor or support new staff which is a great opportunity to develop your leadership skills.
