East Region Health Protection Service launch 12th December 2023

To all care home managers.

Following our letter to you earlier this week regarding the launch of the East Region Health Protection Team we are writing to advise you that the support you receive from the Health Protection Team should not change. However as this is a new service there are differences in the way we would like you to communicate with us.

A new outbreak notification form has been developed and should be used by care homes to report potential outbreak situations, including respiratory, gastrointestinal and other outbreaks of illness/infection. You will find a copy of this at the bottom of this letter and also as an attachment to the accompanying email which we ask you use going forward.

We have also developed the table below, which aims to support care homes to implement national guidance and perform local risk assessments. This table also provides information on how and when to contact our team.

We would be grateful for your feedback as these changes are implemented to allow us to continue to improve and develop the East Region Health Protection service.
