This year 16 Care Homes and approximately 1000 residents participated. The festival is now organised by several partners who are busy working to collate and share this work on a wider scale.

Winter Preparedness: Coming Soon

During the next few months, leading up to Winter, the East Region Health protection Service, with support from the Care Home programme Team, will be developing a suite of resources to support Care Homes with outbreaks of infections during Winter 2025 – 2026. These resources will include:

- A supply of 10 PCR swabs for the identification of respiratory outbreaks and a PCR Testing Flowchart.
- Updates National guidance and posters for the Outbreak Boxes
- A downloadable Webinar on Outbreak Management
- Updates to the Care Home Winter Preparedness pages on the intranet.

Care Home Outbreak Boxes: Update

The aim of the Care Home Outbreak Box is to contain information required during a suspected or confirmed outbreak of either respiratory or gastrointestinal infection. Each box contains relevant National guidance and high-quality printed posters to support Care Homes during episodes of Outbreak.

Outbreak boxes were distributed, in December 2024, by the Care Home Support Teams in Lothian. The uptake was very encouraging with approximately 77 Care Homes initially accepting an outbreak box.

All the information contained within the boxes can be downloaded from the Care Home website within the Outbreak Boxes section of the Outbreak webpage. This information will be updated in September/October 2005, as new or updated guidance for Winter 2025 – 2026 is published.

Between January and June 2025, we asked Care Homes who had experienced an outbreak for feedback on their outbreak box. 80% of respondents reported they had used their box with 90% of

respondents reporting they found the box useful.
