



Breast Screening

Breast screening is a test for breast cancers that are too small to see. In Scotland, only women between the ages of 50 and 70 are offered breast screening every 3 years.

Breast Screening - Social Story



(1) The breast screening appointment will be at your nearest breast screening centre or mobile screening unit.



√ (2) You will be asked to wait in the waiting area until the nurse is ready to see you.



√ (3) The nurse will explain
what is going to happen
during the test before they
begin and will ask if you
have any questions. It is
up to you if you want to go
ahead with the test.



√ (4) The test will take about 30 minutes.



√ (5) The nurse will
ask you to undress
from the waist up.
You can cover up
when you are not
having the test
done. It may be
easier if you are not
wearing a dress.



√ (6) The nurse will show you to the x-ray machine.



- √ (7) The nurse will
 examine one breast at a
 time using the machine.
- ✓ The machine will press your breast firmly for a few seconds, this will feel uncomfortable.



- √ (8) You can ask the nurse to stop the test at any time.
- ✓ You can then get dressed again as your test is finished.



√ (9) You and your GP will also be posted a letter with your results within 3 weeks.



There are 6 breast screening centres in Scotland. You'll have your screening test at one of these centres or at a mobile screening unit. Contact your local breast screening centre (for Lothian phone this number 0131 537 7400) if you:

- have a question about the test or your appointment
- need to change the date or time of your appointment
- have breast implants
- have had breast cancer
- have had a mammogram within the last 6 months
