Who are we looking for?

LANMAC welcomes nominations from individuals interested in advancing and influencing the nursing and midwifery professions. It is important to have representation within the committee's membership that reflects the diversity of nursing and midwifery. No matter what role you have in the nursing and midwifery job family your contribution is equally valid so Clinical Support Workers, Student Nurses, Staff Nurses, and Charge Nurses, Community Nurses, School Nurses, Clinical Nurse Specialists, Advanced Practitioners, Research Nurses, Managers and all other non ward nurses are all encouraged to apply.

Why do it?

This is a good opportunity for frontline nurses and midwives to influence the work we do every day. It will also give you a "different" experience to add to your CV and is an excellent networking opportunity for you with colleagues across the organisation. There are opportunities to work directly with the NMAHP Leadership group. Being on the committee will also involve taking part in development sessions that will also help support your ongoing CPD and contribute towards your revalidation (for registered nurses and midwives).

What would the commitment be?

You would be expected to attend the LANMAC meetings, which would take place four times a year. At the moment meetings would be via Microsoft Teams but we would hope to meet in person again when this is safe and appropriate. The meetings last two hours. In preparation for each meeting there would be papers to read and these would be sent to you at least one week in advance. You would be expected to read these and to note down your thoughts on them and any questions you would like to bring to the meeting. There may also be specific actions after each meeting that would be discussed and agreed.

There may be the opportunity to get involved in individual pieces of work that would involve other meetings (known as Short Life Working Groups) that relate to your specialist area of practice. Occasionally you may be invited to attend events either in NHS Lothian or externally in your role as a LANMAC member.

How to Apply

Feel free to get in touch with either Fiona Ireland or Juliet MacArthur (details below) for more information. If you think you are interested, first of all talk to your line manager and get their support. Application will be by means of a nomination form, which needs to be signed by your line manager and the Associate Nurse Director/Chief Nurse for your service or the Director of Midwifery. Nomination does not always mean that you will be accepted into the role; this really depends on how many nominations are received from different parts of the organisation and from different levels of nursing and midwifery as we need to have a good balance.
