UPDATED NICE GUIDANCE

Important update for CR practitioners following NICE guidance: In Nov 2020, NICE created a new guideline NG 185 Acute Coronary Syndromes (ACS). This replaces previous Clinical Guidelines 172, 167 and 94. NG 185 now covers earlier and longer term (rehabilitation) management of acute coronary syndromes. The HM remains recommended as a form of providing comprehensive cardiac rehabilitation. To view the guidance, go to:

HEART MANUAL, DIGITAL REBOOT & REACH-HF TRAINING

Having adapted the Heart Manual training to run online, during 2020 we held 18 HM Facilitator training courses, 19 Digital Reboots & our HM clinicians delivered two REACH-HF Facilitator training events.
