Leith Community Treatment Centre: Changes to Diabetes Service

This leaflet is to let you know about changes to your diabetes appointments.

Annual Review Appointments (Face to Face)

We plan to see you face to face in the Leith clinic once a year to perform a full annual review. During this appointment we will complete a number of tests including bloods, weight, blood pressure, foot exam and a urine sample. You will see a doctor face to face and there will also be an opportunity to see the diabetes nurse during this visit if needed.

Remote Telephone Consultations

If you need to be reviewed more than once a year, most additional consultations will be done over the telephone.

Pre-telephone clinic screening

Around 2-3 weeks in advance of a telephone consultation, you will be invited to attend Leith community centre for a short appointment with a Clinical Support Worker. In this appointment, you will have a blood test performed, and weight and blood pressure measured. If any of your other annual screening tests have been missed at your annual review (foot exam/ urine sample), they can also be completed. This appointment should be short and you do not need to wait for results.

Preparing for your Diabetes Appointment:

Before your appointment, we suggest you take time to make a note of anything you want to discuss. This will help you get the best out of your appointment.

Blood glucose data

If you monitor blood glucose at home, it is very useful for staff to have access to these measurements (in addition to clinic blood tests).

If you use the FreeStyle Libre, we strongly recommend linking your glucose data to the Western General Hospital using **LibreView**. Instructions on how to do this can be found at: www.edinburghdiabetes.com/libre

If you use a finger-prick blood glucose meter, we recommend that you upload your data using the **Diasend** system. Instructions can be found here: http://www.edinburghdiabetes.com/diasend-wgh

If you cannot access this technology and are using a finger-prick glucose meter, please keep a glucose diary and have the readings handy so you can discuss them during your appointment.
