Prescribing & Referral Guidance

Update on 'Guidance on Inhaled Therapies' Posters

We are delighted to let you know that the review of the 'Guidance on Inhaled Therapies' posters, for Asthma and COPD inhaler prescribing is well underway.

We are awaiting an outcome from formulary discussions in December and it is our intention that the guidance posters will be printed and distributed by the new year.

Once available, the posters will be distributed throughout Lothian and electronic versions will be available on the MCN website.



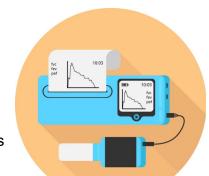
Respiratory Physiology Pressures

Respiratory Physiology is currently facing challenges across Scotland.

In Lothian, there are ongoing workforce issues and the Respiratory Physiology Department have advised that there is a growing waiting list.

The wait for an appointment, pre-covid, was 3-4 weeks, patients are now waiting over 3 months for an appointment (a large percentage are waiting for simple spirometry and FeNO tests). Unfortunately it is unlikely that acute sites will go back to multiple patient testing in single rooms which is compounding the issue.

The MCN are in discussions with both Primary and Secondary Care teams about how best to support the service.



QUIT YOUR WAY

Quit Your Way is a support service for anyone trying to stop smoking tobacco.

If you smoke, stopping smoking is the best thing you can do to improve your physical and mental health. When you get support to stop smoking from Quit Your Way, you are more likely to quit tobacco and stay stopped.

Quit Your Way practitioners will work with you to work on motivation to quit, offering advice and support, they can also arrange Nicotine Replacement Therapy (NRT) through your local pharmacy.

A guide to vaccination eligibility in respiratory disease - Adults



In order to avoid morbidity and mortality it is extremely important that people with eligible respiratory conditions take up appropriate vaccines. Please remind eligible patients at all opportunities. The trusted professional relationship is what makes the difference. Thank you for your support.





COVID-19



Note: Patients who are immunosuppressed due to regular systemic steroid use may also be eligible for vaccines under 'immunosuppression' criteria

Asthma



Eligible if patient is over 50 years requires continuous repeated inhaled use systemic steroids or with any previous asthma exacerbations requiring hospital admission

In relation to respiratory disease, people who only use reliever inhalers (eg. salbutamol) or who do not require continuous or repeated use of steroids (inhaled or systemic) are not eligible for either COVID, flu or pneumococcal vaccination, within the 'at-risk' cohort.



Eligible if patient had ≥ 2 courses of oral corticosteroids in the preceding 24 months or continuous oral steroid use or ≥ 1 asthma-related hospital admission in the preceding 24 months



Asthma is not an indication for pneumococcal vaccine unless so severe as to require frequent or continuous use of systemic steroids

COVID-19



Pneumococcal

Note: Patients who are immunosuppressed due to regular systemic steroid use may also be eligible for vaccines under 'immunosuppression' criteria



Eligibility:

children 6 months to 2 years 'at risk' & from 2 years to high school

Eligible if patient had ≥ 2 courses of oral corticosteroids in the preceding 24 months or continuous oral steroid

or ≥ 1 asthma-related hospital admission in the preceding 24 months

People who only use reliever inhalers (eg. salbutamol) or who do not require continuous or repeated use of steroids (inhaled or systemic) are not eligible for either COVID or pneumococcal vaccination (unless they have other underlying health conditions)



Asthma is **not** an indication for additional pneumococcal vaccine unless so severe as to require frequent or continuous use of systemic steroids.

WORLD COPD DAY—Wednesday 15th November

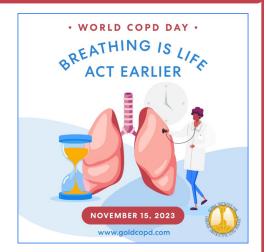
