



SIPCEP – Recent content updates completed

Dear colleagues,

Over the past few months, the NES Public Health Team have updated many educational resources of the Scottish Infection Prevention and Control Education Pathway (SIPCEP), as part of regular educational governance activities.

The key points of the updates were to:

- align content to new clinical guidance, where applicable
- complete other minor content/image updates or corrections
- improve accessibility in line with new requirements
- better represent social care settings, where applicable
- update all web links

All updated eLearning modules now have a date (month/year) on the title screen.

The following **eLearning modules** have been updated on Turas Learn and have been made available for NHS Boards using learnPro:

Future updates and engagement

The 'Winter (21/22), Respiratory Infections in Health and Care Settings Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) Addendum' is currently under review and it is expected that some of the content from the Addendum will be incorporated into the main NIPCM. Our next steps are to ensure that SIPCEP fully reflects this transition.

In 2022/23 we will also review a range of educational resources and we will contact colleagues who have already agreed to be part of our established content advisory groups.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic we have paused our engagement through our various stakeholder groups, but we hope to shortly restart our activities.
