Spotlight on: Lothian Care Academy



OVERVIEW OF PROGRAMME

The Lothian Care Academy (LCA) has been commissioned by the four Local Authorities in Lothian, Integration Boards and NHS Lothian, following a national report of the Scottish Government's Independent Review of Adult Social Care in Scotland. This report was published on 3 February 2021 and highlighted the differences (and inequalities) between health and social care support workers and recommended that priority is given to the development of a holistic approach to workforce planning across health and social care.

Vision for the NHS Lothian Care Academy:

The LCA will deliver high-quality learning by working together with key stakeholders to create a consistent, safe, and best value training offer within Health and Social Care which will attract, develop, and support staff through their care sector roles.

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Summary of Work Completed in 2021/22

LOTHIAN CARE ACADEMY

Over the last year, stakeholders from across Health and Social Care in Lothian have been working on developing the programme and its pilots. Key achievements of the LCA in 2021/22 include:

- Establishing a programme board and clear governance arrangements for the management and collaboration across Lothian
- Launching the mentor programme in selected sites in Edinburgh and West Lothian HSCP; including training and support for mentors. This aims to increase retention of staff in care sector roles
- Analysing the areas for development and shared learning across Lothian; resulting in development of a stoma care training package for Care at Home staff piloting in Edinburgh and West Lothian
- Partnering with specialist teams to collaborate with staff on education and training projects; including the development and pilot of sensory impairment tools and referral processes in East Lothian, the delivery of wound care and leg ulcer management by the Tissue Viability Nurse team, and the creation of a working group to look at Anticipatory Care Planning in Care Homes
- Listening to Care Home and Care at Home staff; resulting in the prioritisation of a dementia programme under the Lothian Care Academy
- Understanding the barriers to competency assessments; through working with Chief Nurses and Central Legal Office
- Launching a recognisable brand for the Lothian
 Care Academy and video to recruit staff into Health
 and Social Care
- Adopting a QI based approach to all pilots to ensure success

In every issue of the newsletter we will highlight two sections of the website that may be of interest.



These may be new sections, sections that have had big changes or sections which cover new information or information we know people are wanting to access but maybe aren't aware it is on the site.

This quarter we will look at the "Education and Training" section and the section where you can find information on making referrals to services

You will find both sections under "Care Homes Information" on the website.

All sections of the website can be accessed via the green menu or if you go to the main page of that section of the site there will be a grid/visual menu you can follow.

Referrals require a few further steps and can be accessed in the section "Supporting Residents' Needs - Services and Referral Pathways" then going into one of four sub sections for a specific topic - if you hover on the title of each subsection this will tell you what is there.

Education and Training

This section details training and education on a wide variety of subjects.

Here you will find details of courses and how to book on to them if booking is required but some can be carried out online.

Oral Care

Palliative care

Referrals to Services

In the "Supporting Residents' Needs - Services and Referral Pathways" section of the website you will find details of services available to all Care Home residents in Lothian.

Alongside the details of services many of them will also have a referral page - some we don't have details for or you can't directly refer someone to.

Many services you can refer a resident directly to yourself. You do not always have to go through the GP or Care Home Support Team (CHST) which supports your home.
